

Professor Roger Byard

Professor Byard holds the George Richard Marks Chair of Pathology at the University of Adelaide and is a Senior Specialist Forensic Pathologist at Forensic Science SA in Adelaide, Australia. He qualified in medicine in Australia in 1978 (University of Tasmania MBBS, BMedSci) and became a licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada in 1982 (LMCC).

He has a specific interest in sudden infant and childhood death and has published, or has in press, over 700 papers in peer-reviewed journals. He coedited *Sudden Infant Death Syndrome - Problems, Progress and Possibilities* (Arnold, 2001), the two volume *Forensic Pathology of Infancy and Childhood* (Springer, 2014), and the four volume *Encyclopaedia of Forensic and Legal Medicine* (2nd ed) (Elsevier/Academic Press, 2016), wrote *Sudden Death in the Young* (3rd ed) (Cambridge University Press, 2010) and coauthored the *Atlas of Forensic Pathology* (Springer 2012). He has been the Editor-in-Chief/Managing Editor of *Forensic Science Medicine and Pathology* (Springer Publishers, New York) since 2008.
