# **COMMUNITY HEALTH**

Course Coordinator: Associated Professor Vera Musil, MD, PhD, specialist in school medicine

#### **OBJECTIVE**

The objective of the Community Health (CH) course is to enable students to understand and develop a positive attitude towards the importance and role of the community in the health and illness of an individual. The course is based on an approach to medical education that emphasises that the primary field of action and work of physicians is the community, not the infirmary or the laboratory. Students gain insight into the treatment of patients at all stages of a disease (from initial contact with the health care system in primary health care, diagnostics, therapy, home visits and workplace visits, to recovery and rehabilitation). They also participate in health education classes, epidemiological and environmental surveys, and public health research and interventions.

#### ORGANIZATION OF CLASSES


Classes take place in the field in the Vukovar-Srijem County (first day) and Požega-Slavonia County. The classes are taught by the University of Zagreb School of Medicine (UZSM) staff and external associates.

Practical exercises are carried out in the health center, public health institutes, general county hospitals, schools, kindergartens, retirement homes, social welfare institutions and in the field (visits to patients with the outpatient health care service, visits to beneficiaries as part of community support projects, public health research and interventions).

In the week before going on the field practice, all students are obligated to attend a preparatory seminar according to the schedule, where lists of students who will attend the course are compiled, and forms for transportation and accommodation are filled in (students are required to provide their IDs).

If health-related circumstances suddenly arise (relevant medical documentation is required) and student is unable to attend the preparatory seminar and field practice they should submit information in writing (with relevant documentation attached) to the e-mail addresses: vmusil@snz.hr: davor.jezek@mef.hr; msgrgec@snz.hr; jasna.gamulin@mef.hr. attendance will be organized additionally in available turns that do not clash with teaching obligations for other courses.

Note: it is possible to replace certain activities by day, due to the availability and availability of external collaborators and the schedule of implementation of public health activities and interventions in the county.

### TRANSPORTATION, ACCOMMODATION AND FOOD

Departure to the field is on Monday at 8:00 a.m.

The return from the field is on Friday until 22:00 p.m.

Departure and return from field practice are exclusively by organized bus transport.

A bus with a driver and a van with a driver are available for transporting students and teachers throughout the field practice for each group.

Arrival and return from field practice without using the organized transport, arbitrary departure from the field practice during the tour and use of individual / personal modes of transport by students are not permitted.

While on the bus and in the van, students must follow the instructions of the teachers and drivers regarding safety rules while the vehicle is in motion and when it stops.



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The accommodation and eating facilities are located in the counties where the field practice is conducted. Accommodation in the facilities is regulated by the House Rules that students will be acquainted with when they arrive at the facility. The facilities are of the closed type (during fieldwork they only host the students, teachers and drivers). Students are accommodated in double and triple rooms. Each room has a separate bathroom (toilet, shower), and is equipped with linen and towels. Three meals a day (breakfast, lunch, dinner) are provided, which are served in the dining room.

#### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING THE COURSE

In order to carry out the field practice in a variety of weather conditions, students should have clothing and footwear appropriate to the situation and their duties during the class.

Clothes should be clean, free of visible damage, ironed, and appropriate for the season. Shoes should be clean, free of visible damage, comfortable, suitable for movement, and appropriate for the season.

Students should maintain personal hygiene on a daily basis.

For attending classes in health institutions (including home visits to patients), students should bring a neat, clean, ironed and undamaged white doctor's coat or blouse, trousers/skirt, appropriate shoes and a stethoscope.

Clothing, footwear and accessories normally worn outside the professional environment and / or for leisure activities are not considered appropriate (e.g. ripped jeans, extremely short skirts, shorts, sleeveless shirts, inappropriate lettering on clothing; shoes / boots / sandals with heels over five centimetres, flip-flops, slippers; loose long hair, long nails with nail polish, jewellery and tattoos on the face and visible parts of the body (piercings and tattoos), heavy make-up, cosmetics, unkempt beards and moustaches, and bulky jewellery).

During the whole course, students have to follow the instructions of the teachers for relevant group and the external associates.

During visits and classes at various institutions, especially the sites of remembrance (Place of Remembrance: Vukovar Hospital 1991, the Memorial Cemetery of Croatian Veterans and Ovčara Memorial), students must adhere to instructions and the rules of conduct, especially the prohibition of smoking and the use of mobile phones (and cameras).

#### COMPLETION OF THE COURSE AND EXAM

The course is completed after attending the preparatory seminar and field practice in its entirety.

During the fieldwork, students must keep a student diary, which is a template for the exam in the form of an essay written on the topic: "COMMUNITY HEALTH - PERSONAL REFLEXION" (1000 words), which is evaluated as "pass / fail".

Students must register for the exam during the exam period for the group they attended, or in the regular summer and autumn exam periods.

Students submit a written exam (essay) during the exam period in which they registered for the exam.

After the course, students fill out the course evaluation.
